Invitation and brief project summary

Thank you for considering participating in this survey. This document explains to you what the work is about and what your participation would involve.

The purpose of this study is to identify visitor interests, travel motivations, and preferences. We are inviting anyone who is or who has visited the *Iveragh Peninsula* to take part in this visitor survey. This survey is carried out as part of the <u>LIVE</u> (LIŷn IVeragh Eco-museums) project, which is a collaboration between Welsh and Irish community organisations, academic departments, and local governments. LIVE aims to enable coastal communities to promote their natural and cultural assets, creating opportunities for sustainable tourism, especially outside the traditional peak tourist seasons.

What would taking part involve?

Should you choose to participate, you will be asked to complete a questionnaire about (1) Your trip characteristics, (2) Cultural interests, (3) Natural interests, (4) Sustainability, and (5) About Your Party (demographic questions). It should take you no longer than 15min to answer all the questions.

Participation in this study is completely voluntary, of course, and you can also refuse to answer specific questions and skip entire sections. All information you provide when you hand over your completed questionnaire will be **confidential** and **your anonymity will be protected throughout the study**.

It goes without saying that you maintain the right to withdraw from the study at any stage up to the point you handover your questionnaire. At that point, your responses will be assigned a participant number and be collated with that of other participants and can no longer be retracted.
